Status Report on the Arctic Shipping Best Practice Information Forum

Background

The purpose of the Arctic Shipping Best Practice Information Forum (hereinafter 'the Forum') is to support the effective implementation of the IMO Polar Code by making publicly available on a dedicated web portal information relevant to all those involved in safe and environmentally sound Arctic shipping, including shipowners/operators, regulators, classification societies, marine insurers, and indigenous and local communities. Operational and other approved documents and resources specific to the Forum include:

- Forum Methods of Operation (final agreed version 14 Feb 2018)²
- Factors to be Considered in Selecting Hyperlinks for Posting to the ASBPIF Web Portal (final agreed version 14 Feb 2018)³

- 4) Review of POLARIS (four years after entry into force of the Polar Code)
- 5) Communications in the Polar Regions: Limitations & Gaps
- 6) Raising the Forum's Public Profile

Forum Web-Portal

At the conclusion of the Forum's 2018 annual meeting, a <u>public Web Portal</u> was launched to assist with the effective implementation of the Polar Code. Accessible at <u>www.arcticshippingforum.is</u>, the Web Portal provides links to an impressive range of authoritative information essential to effective implementation of and compliance with the Polar Code.

In the save-the-date email sent out on 9 December, stakeholders were invited to submit information to the Web Portal, as well as to provide updates and additional information from those who have previously submitted information. Furthermore, stakeholders were welcomed to provide comments on the Web Portal, especially to highlight any gaps in coverage that they may see, and to advise the Forum's Organizing Committee of any relevant projects or initiatives that might be seen as complementary.

The deadline for submissions is <u>1 March 2019</u> using the online template available <u>here</u>.

Next Steps

The Forum Organizing Committee will finalize the meeting agenda, send invitations and finalize all preparations via intersessional telephone calls.

Recommendations

The SEG Co-Chairs and Forum Chair recommend that PAME-I 2019 adopt a ROD:

- welcoming the Forum's progress and its collaborative approach to increasing awareness and availability of authoritative information needed to implement the Polar Code;
- noting that the next Forum meeting is scheduled in conjunction for 3-4 June 2019 in London; and
- instructing the Shipping Expert Group's Co-Chairs and Forum Chair to provide a status report on the Forum at PAME II-2019.
