Clothing:

February is a winter month with the average minimum temperature is about -7 °C (19°F), and the average maximum temperature is -2 °C (30°F). Currency

You cannot use Euro in Norway. The Norwegian currency is Norwegian Kroner (NOK).

1 NOK is about 10 Euro. Credit/debit cards are commonly used.

Visa and entry

Accommodation

ARRIVAL

Getting from Oslo Airport (OSL) to the City Center

There are two options getting from Oslo Airport to Oslo City Center by train.

You find  (public railway transport) and the  [Airport Express](#) train station inside the airport terminal (to your far right when exiting the luggage area).

If you need a recipe the easiest way is to buy the ticket from the vending machines, there is also ticket counters



leaves from platform 4 and takes about 23 minutes. All trains leaving from platform 4 stops at Oslo Central Station (Oslo S). NOK 105, -.

Buy your ticket before you board the train. It will cost NOK 40, - extra if you choose to buy your ticket on board the train

Airport Express leaves from platform 3 and takes about 22 minutes. NOK 196, -.

If you *do not* need a receipt, the simplest option is to swipe your card in the card reader at the station before boarding and select your destination. There is no need to swipe your card again on arrival.

Both VY and the express train has free Wi-Fi no password is required.

Please note that it takes twice the time and is very expensive to travel from OSL (airport) to downtown Oslo by taxi.

Transport within the city

You can easily reach the meeting venue (Miljødirektoratet) by metro from Oslo S/Jernbanetorget. Metro lines 1, 2, 3, and 4 (eastbound) stop at the Helsfyr station.

Tickets for the metro are valid for one hour and are valid on buses, trams, trains and boats within the city borders. You need a ticket for Zone 1 to go to the venue. You must validate the ticket by scanning it at a validator like this:



Exit the metro at **Helsfyr station** to reach the meeting venue. When exiting the train, turn right towards exit “Fyrstikktoget” and make passage through the underground station. When you reach street level, you will see the Norwegian Environment Agency about 100 metres straight ahead. (Walk along the street where you see Norð Bakeri, Dominos Pizza and a flower shop at your left hand side then cross the road at the traffic lights.) The address is Grensesvingen 7.

When returning to the city center, you exit at the metro station “Jernbanetorget (Oslo S)”.
